LRMTA Minutes September 8th, Long and McQuade

Christine called the meeting to order at Long and McQuade. There were 8 members present: Marilyn Sinclair, Christine Rogers, Joan Milton, Betty Jo Radley, Andrew Gierulski, Kate LaRocque, Linda Dickey and Karen MacDonald.

The agenda was approved by Joan with Karen seconding. The May minutes were approved as circulated by Linda Dickey, seconded by Karen. Thanks to Kate for taking notes.

In Brenda's absence, Christine gave the Treasurer's report. Our operating balance is \$654.04 and our awards account balance is \$3275.05. Thanks to Kate and Christine for acting as auditors during the summer months. Christine will return the Finance briefcase to Brenda. Kate's new nameplate has been posted in the Long and McQuade signboard. Reimbursements for nameplate and photocopy expenses will be arranged. Unfortunately, Corrie's branch renewal fee was lost in the mail when it was sent to Christine from ARMTA. She will contact Corrie to write a replacement cheque. Karen had asked Christine on the weekend about the possibility of our branch helping out with her Alberta Music Conference registration fee. After doing her best to estimate projected expenses for the year, Christine calculated that we have about a \$70 cushion for the rest of the year and unfortunately our branch will not be able to offer any compensation to Karen for the fee. Christine reported that Brenda will present the annual financial summary at next month's meeting. Thanks to Brenda for preparing this document. This will be Brenda's last year as treasurer for our group. Karen MacDonald expressed interest in helping out, but was concerned because she lives out of town. Karen moved the Treasurer's report be accepted. Seconded by Linda Dickey.

Kiwanis Festival dates for 2015 are March 16th to 28th. The registration deadline is January 7th. Christine will contact Doreen to see if there is any new information available regarding our concerns about the early registration deadline and piano duo requirements. Christine reported that Steven Yang and Andrew Wetterstrand had won our Kiwanis Festival awards this year.

ARMTA news: Karen reported that efforts to design an ARMTA survey will be discontinued for the time being. The ARMTA Provincial Recognition Fund Awards has \$2100 per year available to ARMTA Branches. Each of the 7 Branches that make up ARMTA Provincial have \$300 per year to use for up to 3 awards to the students of ARMTA members who met the requirements of Branch Awards. Our branch will apply to ARMTA for the following in conjunction with our own branch awards. Christine and Joan will contact Judith Ammann to make arrangements.

- \$100 to junior student in a practical performance exam grades 4-7 with the highest mark
- \$100 to senior student in a practical performance exam grades 8-ARCT with the highest mark
- \$100 to senior theory student (excluding rudiments) in a senior theory exam (history, harmony, keyboard harmony, counterpoint, analysis, pedagogy) with the highest mark in a single exam

Joan reported that CFMTA offers 2 annual awards of \$250 each for innovative Canada Music Week projects to the two entries judged as most worthy by a panel of judges from across Canada. Since the deadline is September 30th, it was suggested that we keep this in mind for next year. If anyone has an idea for a project and is willing to work on the proposal for next year, please contact Christine. Christine reported that she was approached to give feedback regarding the ARMTA newsletter, *Tempo*.

Christine thanked Betty Jo, Lorrie and Mary Lee for helping with the Library showcase and for lending materials to be displayed. Thanks also to Corrie for preparing brochures for the display. Also, thanks to those who offered to take LRMTA posters to be displayed at the Yates, Casa and the AAC office.

Our next coffee and conversation is set for Thursday, September 18th at 9:30 a.m. at Linda Davies' home at 1260-5th Ave. S. (Not 5A). Please call Betty Jo at 329-1655 or Linda at 328-6085 to let them know if you will be attending. Kate will be presenting information on Music Apps and Websites that can be used for teaching.

Christine reported that she had arranged for Kate's new nameplate during the summer and has posted it on the Long and McQuade signboard. During the summer, Brenda went to Music Court to check on our signboard there. She found it on the floor near the back of the store. Brenda took the board for updating. It is currently in Christine's basement. After discussion it was decided that if the board could be properly posted, it was advantageous to have it displayed at Music Court, since it is in the Mall and open Sundays. Christine will check in with Bonnie at Music Court to see what can be arranged. Suggestions included the University of Lethbridge, Southminster Church and the Public Library. If anyone is interested in helping with contacting these places, please let Christine know.
