She will gather information at the Board meeting and report back to us. Betty Jo commented that she is now hosting her website through ARMTA and is very pleased with the outcome. The Allied Arts Council (AAC) AGM will take place on Tuesday, March 25th in the Casa Community Room. Carmen volunteered to attend as our rep. Thank you to Carmen! Christine will RSVP.

A conversation followed regarding recent RCM in-person exams. Teachers commented on their students' experiences. It was decided that we write a letter recommending evaluation opportunities for students, parents, and teachers following exams. Christine will draft a letter and bring it to the membership.

Christine reported on the progress of the design for our new Branch banner. A discussion followed building on the conversation at our January meeting regarding the slogan for our new banner. During the initial banner design process, Christine was able to include both the ARMTA slogan *Cultivating Music in Life* and a secondary slogan on the banner design. Carmen brought an additional suggestion for the secondary slogan that during discussion at the meeting evolved into:

Leadership and Excellence in Music Education in Our Community

It was decided that we present the original (*Providing Leadership in Music Education in our Community*) and the new version of our secondary slogan for a final email vote. Following the results, Christine will complete the design of the top two banner choices and send them out to teachers to make their final choice. Christine will prepare an email and circulate to members.

- Brad has booked the University of Lethbridge Recital Hall for our final recital on Saturday, May 24th at 2:30 p.m. An insurance certificate will be needed and can be arranged after the new ARMTA membership year begins.

Keys to Piano 2025 presented by the University of Lethbridge Conservatory of Music and the Lethbridge Branch of the Alberta Registered Music Teachers' Association will take place Friday, March 14 and Saturday, March 15, 2025 at Casa at 230-8th St. S. Brad invited Linda Dickey to share the story of her musical journey. Because her father was in the RCMP, Linda's early life included moves to Edmonton, Lethbridge and several small rural towns. Piano lessons from local teachers prepared her for her first RCM exam which was with examiner Earle Moss, noted pianist, teacher and composer. Linda remembers that he was very excited that she had prepared one of his compositions for her exam. In Lethbridge, she studied piano from Bea Foster and theory from A.K. Putland and Bruce Barrow, (all early members of our Lethbridge Branch of ARMTA) and began teaching piano in her neighbourhood at the age of 14. Her aunt and uncle Mary and Fred Leister operated Leister's Music in Lethbridge and Linda has many good memories of trips to the music store. After her marriage to her husband Gerry, they settled in Lethbridge to raise their family—Lisa, who works as a radiation technologist, and Tara who teaches piano and early music classes for young children. Linda is proud of her grandson Lucas who is taking piano lessons and is a member of his school band. Linda has been a member of ARMTA for over 50 years and has held the Lethbridge Branch positions of Corresponding Secretary (1982-84), Vice President (1986-88) Treasurer (1988-2000), and President (2000-2002). She continues to teach a full studio of both piano and theory students who regularly take exams and participate in the Lethbridge and District Music and Speech Arts Festival. Along with friend and colleague, Doreen Laing, Linda travelled to many conferences and became a Nationally Certified Teacher of Music (NCTM) through the MTNA (Music Teachers National Association) Professional Certification Program.

Carmen passed around copies of piano music by Marie Jaëll. Carmen plans to organize an event in May featuring her music since this year is the 100th anniversary of her death. Here are links to Marie Jaëll's intermediate works.
