LRMTA Meeting Minutes for Feb. 6, 2012

- Suzanne Lint and Claire Hatton did a presentation/discussion on the new Lethbridge Community Arts Centre (LCAC).
 - o will be open January 2013, running by March/April (moving in period).
 - o 2 floors, ~3x size of the Bowman Arts Centre (BAC), 1/3 will be occupied by the Conservatory of Music.
 - Community room will have a grand piano, 180 cabaret seating (very large), black like Sterndale Bennett. Book it through Claire for \$15/hour. The piano will be available to appropriate users who know how to take care of it. You can also book the kitchen when using this room.
 - o Mon/Tues/Wed bookings at the LCAC will be for ongoing regular activities. Thu/Fri/Sat/Sun will be for one-offs (recitals, performances, sales, non-monthly).
 - o Hours: 9am-10pm; 10am-7pm Sundays.
 - o Better chairs (stackable).
 - o Will there be a podium w/ mic? They hadn't considered that yet, but they agreed it would be a good thing to have so they will look into it.
 - Will VHS be viewable there? Yes, but only on a TV at the moment (but perhaps if someone has the right cables, it could be viewable on a projector). It was discussed that people with VHS should convert it to DVD (via a person with such equipment) before it's too late.
 - o In March/April, they will call for schedules to plan for the next year. If there are conflicting schedules and it cannot be resolved, a lottery will be done.
 - The year will run from Sept-Aug.
 - For recitals definitely want to direct us to the community room, as it is large and has a grand piano, but we may also be able to use the meeting room with an upright piano and only 15-20 audience members. Donations during the recitals are ok
 - Will the piano be tuned? Not by LCAC, but maybe by the U of L.
 - o Insurance covered by LCAC.
 - There will be a programmable TV with announcements, as well as an outdoor sign.
 - What happens to BAC? No decision yet, but it will be closed for a time. It may be used for storage for arts groups. It will cost a lot to keep as it has massive foundation issues.
 - Some days will have open house performances.
